Re: Summer Uniform

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are well. I am writing to highlight the importance of school uniform and the positive impact it has on our learners and our wider school community.

A consistent and smart uniform helps create a strong sense of belonging. When learners arrive, each morning dressed in the same colours and standards, it reinforces that they are part of a shared community. Uniform also removes unnecessary pressures around clothing choices and helps ensure that all learners feel included and equal.

Just as importantly, wearing the correct uniform encourages learners to **take pride** in their appearance and in their school. When children look smart, they tend to carry themselves with more confidence. It sets a positive tone for learning and supports the high expectations we hold for every learner.

As we approach the warmer months, we would like to remind families that summer uniform **may be** worn after Easter. This includes the purple polo shirt and black shorts. However, it is essential that **shorts are of a reasonable length** and suitable for a school environment. Items such as **Nike Pro-style shorts** or similar sports shorts are not acceptable as part of our uniform. If shorts do not meet the expectations outlined in our policy, learners will be isolated until a parent or carer brings the correct uniform.

We would also like to remind parents that **leggings, hoodies, and white socks** worn over tights are not permitted. These items do not form part of our uniform and should not be worn in school.

In addition, the rules regarding **hair colourings and facial piercings** remain unchanged. These expectations were reviewed and reinforced by the governing body in the Autumn term, and we appreciate your continued support in upholding them.

As we move into the Easter break, we would also like to stress the importance of revision for our Key Stage 4 and 5 learners. This period is crucial in preparing for upcoming examinations, and we strongly encourage learners to make good use of their time. We are pleased that staff are kindly offering revision sessions over Easter, and we hope learners will take full advantage of these opportunities.
