Dear Parent/Carer,

Over the last month, learners have been completing the Welsh Government online personalised assessments in reading and numeracy.

Learners can log in to their Hwb account at any time to view their previous assessment performance. The assessments provide standardised scores, where a score of **100** is considered average. They also identify individual areas of strength and areas for development.

As a general guide, standardised scores can help indicate how a learner is progressing. A score of around **95** may suggest that a learner is working towards the level needed to achieve a C grade in future GCSE examinations. A score of **120 or above** may indicate that a learner is working at a higher level and could be considered more able.

Learners in Years 7 and 8 will complete the assessments again during the next academic year.

If you feel your child would benefit from additional support in numeracy or reading, intervention staff are available after school from Monday to Thursday until **3:50 pm**.
