What's different about secondary school?

CCYD is much bigger than your primary school. You will move from classroom to classroom for your different lessons. You will also need to carry your bag and anything you need for that day - books, PE kit, food ingredients etc.

You will have 5 different lessons with different teachers each day. Don't worry, you will get to know them in no time at all!

There may be some subjects that are completely new to you - French, Computing, Design Technology and some of the sports on offer.

You will have the opportunity to participate in a number of extra-curricular activities, after school clubs and we run many school trips.

You will have a timetable to help you remain organised and ready for the day ahead. It may take a little time to get used to being independent.

You may be wearing a full school uniform for the first time. You must wear your uniform every day and your form tutors will check this each morning.

Top Tip: Pack your bag the night before and only bring in what you need for that day.

Your School Day

Being in secondary school is different to your primary school in many ways. One of the main differences is that you move from classroom to classroom for your different subjects rather than staying in the same classroom all day.

You will be given a timetable on your first day and a tour of the school. This is so that you can find your way round and identify all the subject departments, toilet blocks, reception, pastoral office, library and canteen that you will visit during the school day.

ClassCharts App

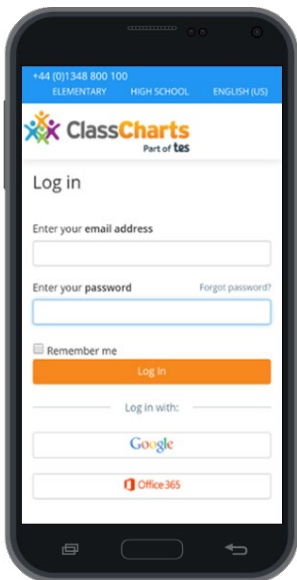
You and your parents can keep track of your attendance, timetable, achievements, sanctions and important messages / announcements via the ClassCharts App.

This app can be downloaded onto a mobile phone (Apple & Android) and is our main method of communicating information home. You will be given a code to register in September.

Ready for Learning

We advise learners to be in school by 8.15 so that you have time to settle before morning registration at 8.30. You must be on time for lessons and you will be asked to line up outside your classroom. You will then be welcomed into each classroom and will need to get your equipment (stationery and books) ready to begin learning.

What should I do If I'm unhappy about anything?

Your Head of Year, form teacher and student support officers are available if you need support. Any of your teachers will also be willing to answer any questions you may have.



Mobile Phones

At CCYD our priority is to create a safe and supportive learning environment that is free from unnecessary distractions and the potential for unkind behaviour, often associated with smartphones and social media. In order to safeguard all learners and create a focused and supportive learning environment we have adopted a complete ban on the use of mobile phones and electronic devices throughout the school day - including break times, lunchtimes and lesson transitions.

Expectations:

1. Mobile phones must be switched off and stored in school bags from the moment learners enter the school gates until the end of the school day.
2. Headphones, AirPods and similar devices must not be used at any time during the school day and should be left at home.
3. If a mobile phone is seen or heard during the school day, it will be confiscated and placed into a secure locker. Parents/Carers will be expected to collect the mobile phone or electronic device at the end of the school day between 3pm – 3.30pm.
4. If a learner refuses to hand over their phone, they will be placed in internal isolation and parents/carers will be contacted and required to attend an urgent meeting. Learners who refuse to hand over their mobile phone or electrical device risk receiving a fixed-term exclusion.
5. In an emergency, parents/carers should contact the school directly via the main office and/or the pastoral office. If there is a situation which requires communication with home, learners must speak to a member of pastoral staff who will deal with the matter.
6. Mobile phone devices used for medical purposes will be permitted.
7. In cases where mobile phone misuse is persistent and/or severe, such as filming others without consent or engaging in malicious, harmful, or inappropriate activity, more serious consequences will follow. These may include internal isolation, fixed-term exclusion or permanent exclusion.

What if I am late or absent?

The school doors will close at 8.30am, if you arrive after this time you will need to sign in at the 'READY2LEARN' centre, there are signs that will direct you from the main entrance to this location.

What do I do for lunch

We advise in the first few weeks of school you bring a packed lunch if possible. We will send out consent forms for thumbprints to be used for cashless catering in the first few weeks so that the school's canteen can be used. There are a range of options but we encourage you to make wise choices to manage your spend between break and lunch times.



School Gateway / Access PaySuite

We use a cashless system in school for you to pay for any food/drinks that you buy at break and lunch times. This system uses fingerprint or Pin code to access your account. It is the way that your parents can pay for any school trips or other events during the year. If you receive Free School Meals then your account will be automatically updated everyday with the daily amount. Your parents need to register online using the info we will provide you. Please keep the account topped up.

Parent Information

Our teachers spend most of their day in the classroom. Therefore, it is difficult for them to respond to or speak to you immediately. Most queries can be initially directed to your child's form tutor by telephoning the school. If you need to speak to Mrs Stockton then a message can be left with the Main Office/Reception. Subject teachers can also be contacted this way. The school will communicate with you through SIMS inTouch App and ClassChartsApp, we also communicate with parents via our website, Twitter feed and Facebook page.

Pastoral Support Officers

We have three full time Pastoral Support Officers working in the school. Their roles are to support both learners and their families to secure regular attendance. They can also support a range of wellbeing issues which may be affecting a learner's education. The team can be contacted via the Main Office.

Attendance

You may have already heard about 'Attend to Achieve - Miss School Miss Out' attendance guidance.

In a bid to support your attendance and prevent you from becoming a 'persistent absentee', we (our feeder primary schools and CCYD) have set our attendance target as 92%.

We hope that you will join your form in achieving positive attendance, and win the whole school's attendance league competition!

Transport

All new starters will receive a letter from Bridgend County Borough Council providing details of the transport arrangements for your child in preparation for their new school in September.

School Carpark / Bus Bays

Please be vigilant around the school carpark of moving vehicles. Do NOT run and always use the pavements/crossings provided.

Walking / Cycling / Scootering

Please adhere to the highway code when using the roads, pavements and crossings. Do not use your mobile phone when crossing the road. Be mindful of the general public and our community when travelling to and from school. You are a representative of the school when wearing the uniform so no bad language or inappropriate behaviour.

Wellbeing & Emotional Support

The school offers a range of behaviour, wellbeing and emotional support via the ReadyToLearn Centre.



There are 3 dedicated ReadyToLearn Learning Support Officers who offer this support every day to learners who require additional support

The centre is split into 3 sections - Behaviour / Wellbeing & Emotional Support

The ReadyToLearn Centre uses the Thrive approach to assess emotional development and create action plans with exciting activities to improve emotional wellbeing.



There is a area where learners can undertake small group work or independent learning. This is useful if they need a quiet space to work or need to take time out due to difficult circumstances.

The facility also hosts a quiet and accessible space for learners with temporary mobility issues to access learning rather than be at home.

ALN & Learner Support



At CCYD we recognise that all learners come to school at different stages of development and with different needs. Whilst many factors contribute to the range of difficulties experienced by some children, we believe that much can be done to overcome them by parents, teachers and learners working together.

Learners who meet the locally agreed criteria for having ALN will be supported by class teachers, teaching assistants, other adults and the learning environment. ALN learners and learners who are recognised as needed support will access the following:-

- Learner Support Centre with a range of 1:1 and group rooms to offer bespoke support.
- Learning Support Officers (Literacy/Numeracy, ELSA, Thrive, bespoke ASD support, fresh start, gross motor skills, speech & Language programmes, physiotherapy programmes, structured activities at break and lunch time)
- Learning Support Assistants (In class shared support)
- School Counsellor & Independent School Counsellor
- Nurture - structured support at break and lunch time
- Visual timetables, Daily check
- Homework help
- Access arrangements and assessments

LRC / MLD Provision



CCYD is proud to be home to a specific Learning Resource Centre. There is a cohort in each year group, taught as a smaller class by subject specialist teachers throughout the school. Places in the provision are granted by the Local Authority with strict criteria to support the most vulnerable learners.

Learners who attend the MLD provision are fully integrated into the school building. Learners in the MLD provision access a wide range of intervention and support programs to assist their academic, social and emotional development while supporting independence. The class is supported by additional learning support staff who are able to ensure all children are valued, respected and nurtured.

The team endeavour to provide the best educational opportunities for each child and strive to maximise their potential in a 'can do' learning culture.

Whilst many factors contribute to the range of difficulties experienced by some learners, we believe that much can be done to overcome them by parents, teachers and learners working together.

CCYD school values the abilities and achievements of all its learners and all learners in this provision and full members of CCYD and full integrated into mainstream school life.

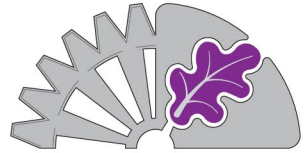
